Accommodation will be available, mainly in Oriel College, for the Friday night, 24 March, and (for those who wish to arrive early or stay until Sunday) for the nights of Thursday 23 March and Saturday 25 March as well. The conference fee of 37.50 euros (£25.00) will cover the cost of lunch on 25 March and of coffee and tea throughout the meeting.
